

Child custody laws need shock treatment

The recent incident in which Fathers 4 Justice members bombarded English Prime Minister Tony Blair with a flour-filled condom during a Parliament session is an event that was due to happen. England has the worst justice system when it comes to dealing with childcustody and divorce issues.

This is not to trivialize what is going on in other countries that are just a step behind, such as Canada, New Zealand and Australia. But it is the worst in England because cases are shrouded in secrecy. The public and press are not allowed to attend.
